Please read this guide carefully before you begin playing.

Before You Play

Install Batteries

Batteries required: 4 x "AA" size (not included)

To Replace Batteries

1. Open the battery compartment cover with a screwdriver. Place the batteries in the compartment, be sure that (+) & (-) are in the correct positions.
2. Batteries must always be replaced by an adult. Never let a child use this product unless the battery door is secured.
3. Keep batteries away from small children.
4. Immediately and safely dispose of all used batteries.

Attention

1. Do not mix old and new batteries.
2. Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.

Important Safety Instructions

Please read this section carefully.

Read and follow these instructions.

1. Do not use this device near water.
2. Clean only with a dry cloth.
3. Do not use near any heat sources such as radiators, heaters, stoves, or other heat producing machinery.

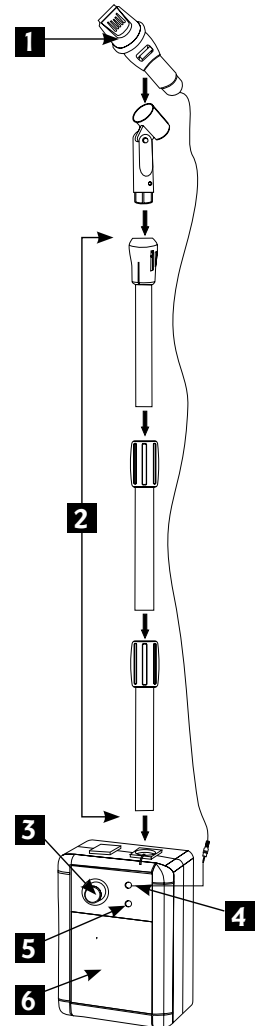
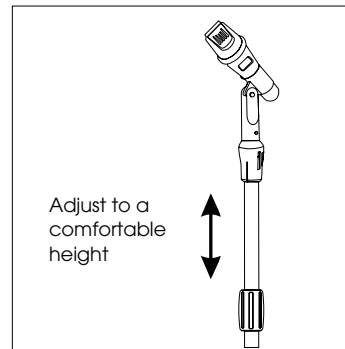
and on, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one or more of the following measures:
